Nakato starts to treat her sister like a leper and tries to avoid her. Christine Babirye catches on and wants to clear the air. She is upset by her sister's actions and she disappears in the dead of the night in the middle of lockdown after curfew time. She just wants to get away and clear her head. This does the trick.

Catherine is worried. She has never been away from her sister and now she has literally driven her away. She calls around frantically but no one has heard from Babirye. After she talks with her Auntie who talks some sense into her does she realize that she has been treating her sister the way the world treats her. Shunning her for who she is. She is worried about her sister and her wellbeing in the middle of the pandemic that has locked down the whole world.

She needs to find a way to get her sister back no matter what. Only then can they move forward as a unit like they always have been.

Bi!? Treatment

The film starts with a pan of pictures of the twins together and happy doing different activities. They are so alike it is impossible to tell them apart. They are one unit and seem inseparable.

They are folding laundry together chatting happily. They have just gotten news that lockdown has been extended and the pandemic is getting worse around the world. For now they are happy that they have each other.

Christine picks up her phone to read a text. She leaves the room for a while and her Catherine picks the phone and is alarmed by the message.

The following day; In the kitchen, the twins discuss lockdown. They have been locked up for three weeks and there has been an extension. Catherine is exhausted. Christine says that she is enjoying the lockdown but she missed her friends. Catherine is making breakfast and she separates the two plates. Christine notices that one is marked underneath. She asks why? Catherine will not explain. Christine picks the unmarked plate and walks away.

In the living room as they eat breakfast, Catherine addresses Christine's sexuality, she is worried about her. Christine asks if that is the reason she separated and marked the plates.

Catherine is worried that she might also be homosexual. She does not want to be locked up with her sister. What if they are caught and punished? Christine points out that neither of them has anywhere to go, and no movement is allowed.

The twins are arguing. Catherine will not stay in the same room as Christine. Christine locks herself in her room. In the dead of the night she leaves. Catherine checks and finds that her sister is missing. Now she is worried. There is no night movement allowed. She has driven her out into the unknown.

Catherine has a frantic morning calling every one that she knows. She is in tears. Her Auntie asks her what happened. She reveals the cause of the argument. Her Auntie talks to her...they are sisters, she needs to support her sister.

Catherine is in tears, she is crying. She tries calling her sister. The phone is ringing but there is no answer.

Christine is in the garage in their car. She is also crying her eyes out. She sees missed calls from her sister. She does not answer. She reads a text message. "I am sorry, please come back home. I was wrong. I love you no matter what'.

Catherine falls asleep in Christine's room on her sister's bed. Christine comes into the room in the dead of the night and lies by her sister.

She wakes up to breakfast in bed. Catherine has made her breakfast and there is a note. She is apologizing. Christine lifts the plate to see if there is a mark. There is none, she smiles.

They talk. Christine feels so alone every single day knowing the rules against homosexuality in their country, she feels locked up even when there is no lockdown. She can never be herself. She at least hoped that she could be herself around her sister.

Catherine says she understands. They cannot turn against each other. They are locked up together. They are so alike and just the fact that they love differently should not make a difference. They have to make it work.
